The following is from the resolution adopted by the San Francisco Labor Council in June 2003

Whereas, Coca-Cola workers in Colombia represented by SINALTRAINAL, the National Union of Food & Beverage Workers, have seen the assassination of eight of their union leaders by paramilitary death squads, forced displacements, death threats, jailing of unionists on trumped-up charges, raiding of union offices and homes of members, torture and kidnapping, union decertification, violation of collective bargaining agreements, and mass firings; and, ...

Whereas, Teamsters President James P. Hoffa commented after the August 31, 2002 murder of SINALTRAINAL leader Adolfo de Jesus Munera Lopez: "Coca-Cola's code of conduct has proven to be ineffective against the extreme violence facing workers in Colombia. This company must take responsibility... We join with other unions and international human rights groups in demanding that Coke stop the violence against workers"; and ...

Whereas, SINALTRAINAL President William Mendoza addressed the recent International Longshore & Warehouse Union convention, and the delegates, clearly shaken by Mendoza's account of the terror Coke workers are facing, voted to make Brother Mendoza an honorary member of the ILWU, voted to

support a boycott Coke campaign, voted to remove all Coca-Cola products from vending machines in union buildings, and voted to demand an end to US military aid to Colombia; and ...

**THEREFORE BE IT**

**RESOLVED, that in solidarity with our brother and sister workers in Colombia, and because we cannot support a company that profits from murder and torture, the San Francisco Labor Council, AFL-CIO, supports the "Stop Killer Coke!" campaign being launched in July 2003 by SINALTRAINAL behind the slogan "Undrinkable! Undrinkable!" – and calls on our members, affiliated labor bodies, state federation, national unions and AFL-CIO to do the same; and**

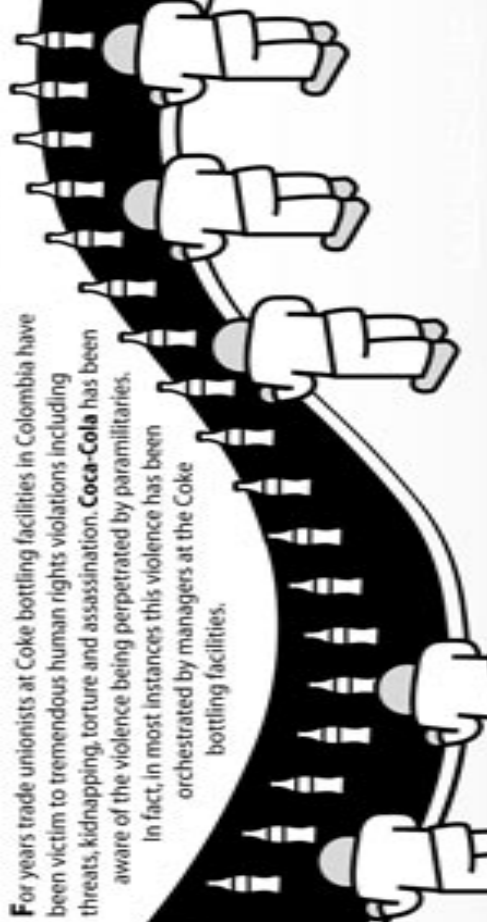

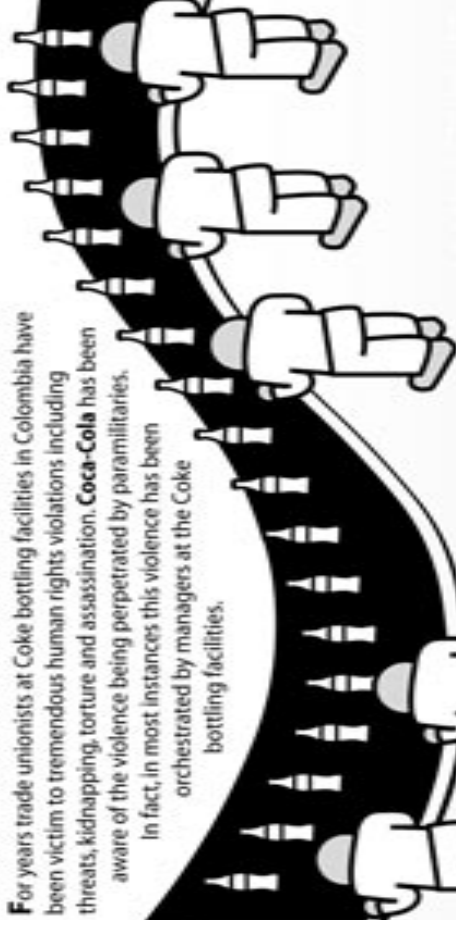
